

National Conference on "Judicial Response to Cases of Sexual and Gender Based Violence"

Crime against women: Besides legislation, respect for women be ensured, Hon'ble Mr. Justice Qazi Faez Isa



Senior Puisne Judge of Supreme Court of Pakistan, Hon'ble Mr. Justice Qazi Faez Isa stated that apart from going through legislative steps on crimes against women, ensuring respect for women may also prove to be a salutary step for declining the rates of such crimes.

He was addressing a National Conference on "Judicial Response to cases of sexual and gender-based violence", jointly organized by the Federal Judicial Academy and Legal Aid Society, Karachi, at a local hotel on May 14, 2022.

He also expressed his concern about the language of enacted Laws, and lamented the laws in Pakistan not being enacted in the Urdu language which would have been proved useful for the ordinary citizens of the country.

The Hon'ble Judge said that it took 27 years to legally consider rape as a heinous criminal offense, which was codified as Zina Bil Jabr. Justice Isa, however, questioned as to who will answer to Allah for the brutality faced by women during this period.



Speaking on the occasion, Justice (Retd) Qazi Muhammad Amin Ahmed expressed his grief on Low complaint rates of sexual abuse, said that 75 percent of sexual harassment cases were not reported, adding that the trial of sexual harassment cases should be proceeded with at the earliest and decided in a short span. He also worried about the low incentives provided to the concerned officials saying that the investigation officers were paid only Rs500 for investigation of such cases while the fee for a DNA test in sexual harassment cases was Rs14,000, adding that the whole system for provision of justice had failed in this regard.

Justice (Retd) Nasira Javed recommended the special arrangements for the proceedings pertaining to the gender based crimes with a special time limit of two months to conclude. She also stressed on active role of NGOs in providing legal aid to the victims of sexual abuse instead of passive roles stating that the NGOs, instead of holding functions and

seminars on rights of women, should utilize their resources to provide legal aid to the affected women folk.


Judicial Officers asked to conduct themselves according to a code of conduct.

A Judge of Supreme Court of Pakistan, Hon'ble Mr. Justice Yahya Afridi advised the young judicial officers to act with credibility and integrity as both these virtues endure long and enhance public confidence in the institution.

These views were expressed by him in the distribution ceremony certificate at the one-week Professional conclusion of a Exchange Programme for Pre-service Training of Judicial Officers from Khyber Pakhtunkhwa on April 23, 2022.

While counselling the trainee judges, the Hon'ble Judge of the Apex Court stated, "A good judge always manifests and professes the high standards of judicial conduct to reinforce public confidence in the judiciary."

He concluded his address with a note, "Keep in mind that the career of a judge has to depend only on his professionalism, honesty, impeccable reputation and trust of society."




Pre-service Training of Judicial Officers from Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa concluded at Federal Judicial Academy
