### Training in New Laws Necessary for Judicial Officers: Judge

Senior Civil Judges urged to apply and uphold law, exercise forbearance, listen to litigant public properly and give them swift relief

**ISLAMABAD** : “As judges have to confront with various sensitive and complex cases, there is a need to provide training for them in new laws, emerging trends and skills for speedy dispensation of justice”, Judge Anti-Terrorism Court, Islamabad, Kausar Abbas Zaidi said on Saturday.

Addressing the Senior Civil Judges in the certificate awarding ceremony at the conclusion of a one-week training course on the topic “ New Laws” held at the Federal Judicial Academy, he said, "Continuous judicial education and training of judges is a novel idea for improving their knowledge and enhancing “delivery of timely justice”.

Noting that new laws are being introduced and diverse complex nature cases are emerging, Judge Kausar said, "This has resulted in the need for judicial officers to undergo training like this."

Regarding judgeship Zaidi said that, “A judge has a great responsibility, he/she must maintain the dignity of his/her judgeship. A good judge should have courage and integrity, patience, open-mindedness, courtesy, compassion, and humility.”

“A judge should always apply and uphold law, exercise forbearance, listen to the litigant public properly and give them swift relief,” he observed.

Speaking on the occasion, Mr. Fakhar Hayat, DG, FJA presented an overview of the training course and said that, “Law is like an ocean. Nobody can claim that he or she is an authority on law. We are all always learners. This training course aimed to provide you a platform to learn from the learned resource persons and share knowledge and information regarding new laws, subjects and topics , so as to make various recipients from different parts the country, Azad Jammu and Kashmir and Gilgit-Baltistan , equipped with the requisite knowledge, understanding and tools for effective administration of justice.”
