

# Training on “Capacity Building for Improved Service Delivery” for Civil Judges/Magistrates begins at FJA

Islamabad: A one-week training on “Capacity Building for Improved Service Delivery” commenced at the Federal Judicial Academy, Islamabad, on October 12, 2020.

While inaugurating the training course, Director General of the Academy Mr. Hayat Ali Shah stated, “This type of training courses aim to build and reinforce the capacities of judicial officers based on needs assessed at a local level.
